**ALZHEIMER'S RESEARCH** -Recently I attended a most interesting U3A talk by Dr Simon Bell of the Sheffield Institute for Translational Neuroscience, where he is the NIHR Lecturer in clinical neurology. He is seeking healthy volunteers to join the control group for his Alzheimer Metabolic Imaging Study. This involves having a brain scan, blood test, and skin sample to examine mitochondrial energy generation. They also do some memory testing and ask people optionally if they are happy to have a lumbar puncture. I am participating.
