Lizzi updates us the following news from her friend from Afghanistan.



I would like to thank everyone sincerely from the bottom of my heart for donating and making this possible. I couldn't do it without your help and support. I can't thank you enough. May God bless you all and I wish you all the best."

This will make his life in the UK much easier as he will now be able to prove his right to work to employers and will be helpful when his families case goes to court with the aim of reuniting him with his siblings here in the UK.
