On the second Sunday of each month we tackle a different topic, with a panel discussion, and lots of time for questions and responses from guest speakers.


8 SEPTEMBER 7PM PLANET CRISIS: A STRATEGIC RESPONSE A PERSONAL RESPONSE

Jo Chamberlain is the Church of England's National Environment Policy Officer, working to engage with the world and the church on the crucial environmental issues facing us. She was previously the Diocesan Environment Officer for Sheffield and part of the Church Engagement team at Christian Aid.

Dr Will Rolls is the strategic lead on Climate Change for Chesterfield Borough Council, and is about to start working for Derby Diocese managing the diocesan Net Zero Programme. His background is in natural resource management and his doctoral research was into the sustainability of solid forest-sourced biofuels.

Revd Michael Bayley is part of St Mark's Environment Group, and instrumental in St Mark's achieving the Gold Eco Award.



SHEFFIELD CHURCH ACTION ON POVERTY'S 15TH PILGRIMAGE GOES

THROUGH ST MARK'S PARISH -This year's Urban Poverty Pilgrimage is a linear walk taking place on **Saturday 19 October.** The route goes through St Mark's Parish and Mission Area. We shall explore community issues and church social action with a number of churches. **We assemble between 9 and 930 at St Andrew's United Reformed Church, Broomhall, Upper Hanover Street,** where we shall hold our opening service and learn about projects in BroomhalL Then we shall walk, via Ben's Centre, to St Mark's Church, for a discussion with some people from the church over tea and coffee. Then we shall walk to St Mary's, Walkley, for a similar discussion, while we eat our packed lunches. Our last visit is to Sacred Heart Roman Catholic Church, Hillsborough, with discussion and final prayers ending around 230 pm/3pm. From there, it is an easy tram or bus ride back to Broomhall or to the City Centre. The total walk is around 2.8 miles. It is urban but picturesque with some uphill and some quite steep downhill stretches. All are welcome on the pilgrimage. The change of Government brings with it new opportunities for lobbying and campaigning

for more progressive climate and nature policies. Three of the new cabinet members are South Yorkshire MPs (with Ed Miliband at Energy Security and Net Zero, Louise Haigh at Transport and John Healey at Defence), and there is much talk of Metro Mayors such as Oliver Coppard having 'trailblazer' devolution deals with increased powers and flexible funding to support the retrofitting of properties and improving energy efficiency.

Our AGM in September will be reviewing what we've been doing as an Alliance over the past year, but will also provide an opportunity for all Alliance members and supporters to discuss how we should respond together to this change of Government and all that could flow from it at Regional and Local Authority levels.

Support the campaign for the Climate and Nature Bill

The CAN Bill will address the full extent of the climate and nature crisis in line with the most up-to-date science. In May 2024 it had cross party backing of over 150 MPs. Help get it into the next Parliament!



Now that we have a new government, we want every MP to support the Climate and Nature Bill. It will make us:

Better off - by ensuring our homes are properly insulated, and our energy is cleaner, less expensive and more secure

Healthier - by reducing air pollution, and by encouraging healthier, more sustainable food consumption, while supporting our farmers

Happier - by protecting our green spaces and the wildlife that depends on them, ensuring everyone has access to nature

More resilient - by reducing the threats from extreme weather, such as flooding, erosion, and crop failure

What action can we take to get the Climate and Nature Bill passed into law?

At the beginning of each session of Parliament there is a Private Members Bill Ballot which all backbench MPs can enter. All the MP has to do at this stage is to enter his or her name in a book. The ballot will be drawn on 5 September. Only 20 MPs will be successful and they will be ranked. The higher the ranking the better the chances of success. At this point the MPs do not have to say what their proposed bill is. They have to do this by October 15.

Open At this stage of Parliament the best prospect of getting the Climate and Nature Bill passed is by getting it adopted as a private members bill. Provided one of the successful MPs is prepared to adopt the bill the chances of it being passed aregood because it has wide cross-party support and very wide public support. On August 15 all MPs are being sent a letter from over 500 scientists and this letter is being published.

What you can do now!

Write to your MP. If you are doing so before September 5 ask them to enter the ballot and if they are successful to nominate the Climate and Nature Bill as the bill they want to support. If you are writing after September 5 write to your MP as soon as possible to ask them to lobby successful MPs in the Private Members Bill Ballot asking them to adopt the bill. Note that this must be done before October 15 but it needs to be done as soon as possible.

Please ask family, friends and neighbours to do the same. If we act swiftly now there is a good chance we can get this critical legislation in place but it needs action now.
