### ST. MARK'S NEWS:

**NEW YOUNG MUSICIANS** - We interviewed 4 young musicians on 17 October who will be joining St Mark's. They range from 10-13 years old. We will be welcoming them at our 10am service on 27 October.

**ADMINISTRATION OF HOLY COMMUNION** – The PCC met on Monday 21 October and reviewed the verbal and written feedback and the observations we have made we during our 3-month trial of offering both the common cup and intinction. Most people were delighted we are now offering the chalice and have returned to receiving a wafer and drinking directly from the shared common cup. A few have expressed the preference that we continue to offer the option of intinction because of concerns about transmission of contagious diseases or that we are not being inclusive if we don't cater for peoples' different needs or preferences. After a thorough discussion, the PCC have decided that once we have sourced an appropriate gluten free bread, if possible one that also meets the needs of communicants with other allergies, we will stop offering intinction and move to the single option of bread and common cup. Receiving bread or wine only is considered full Communion and there is no pressure for anyone to drink from the Common Cup. Those who do not want to drink from the Common Cup will be offered the chalice and given the chance to hold it for a moment and then return it to the chalice bearer without consuming any wine. We have heard from other churches that this has been well received and offers a meaningful connection to the cup for those who would rather not drink from it. *Shan and Beth*

**CONGRATULATIONS** – By now most of you will have heard the following news which was announced at the services on Sunday 13 October and very well received.

*The Bishop of Sheffield is delighted to announce that, following a thorough appointment process, the Revd Dr Beth Keith has been appointed Vicar of the Benefice of St Mark Broomhill and Priest-in-Charge of the Benefice of St Mary Walkley and Oversight Minister of the Three Spires Mission Area. Beth and the family are, of course, very well known to us all. We're not yet sure when the licensing service will be, but at that point, Beth will begin her responsibilities across both churches.*

We would like to convey our thanks to all who were involved in the appointment process and look forward to starting a new chapter in the life of St Mark's. Please hold Beth and her family in your prayers as she prepares to move house and take up this new post with us and St Mary's.

**MIDDLE EAST HUMANITARIAN APPEAL** – I'm sure all of you have all seen or heard the news at some time in the last week and are aware of the devastation that the conflict in the Middle East has caused to civilians.

In Gaza, ninety percent of the population are displaced and in Lebanon, more than a million people have had to leave their homes in search of safety. The DEC has launched an emergency appeal to provide the basics of food, emergency shelter and medical assistance. 

## 'THE CRY FOR HOPE' OF THE PALESTINIAN CHRISTIANS

A study session at St Mark's Church  
Broomfield Road, Sheffield, S10 2SE  
7 pm to 8.30 pm on Sunday 10 November

In July 2020 Kairos Palestine, 'the most extensive Palestinian Christian ecumenical non-violent movement' in partnerships with Global Kairos for Justice, 'a worldwide coalition of concerned Christians from different churches', issued a 'call for decisive action' to Christians throughout the world. Here are some passages from the Cry for Hope:

- 'We have arrived at a critical point in the struggle to end the oppression of the Palestinian people...The State of 'Israel's adoption of the Nation State Law in 2018 legalized institutional discrimination in Israel and the Palestinian territories'.
- 'We call upon all Christians and on churches at congregational, denominational, national, and global ecumenical levels to engage in a process of study, reflection and confession concerning the historic and systemic deprivation of the rights of the Palestinian people.
- Both organisations support 'ending the Israeli colonization of Palestine and advocating for the right of self-determination of Palestinian people and peace with justice for all people in the holy land'

**In February, General Synod will be asked whether the Church of England should sign up to this document.** At our meeting, Jenny Bywater will tell us of her experiences as an Ecumenical Accompanier in the West Bank, Mark James will speak about the Cry for Hope and David Price will offer a critique of the document. There will then be discussion.

**GOOD NEWS ON THE CLIMATE AND NATURE BILL** - Now is an exciting moment for the Climate and Nature Bill, the only plan for a new UK law that addresses the full extent of the climate and nature crisis in line with the most up-to-date science. Thanks to Dr Roz Savage MP, the Bill is now going through Parliament but it needs our help. We need at least 102 MPs to attend the second reading and support the bill on Friday 24 January to take it to the Committee stage. ### OCTOBER ECO TIP

This year, we will be supporting the Eco Tip calendar provided by [Rocha](#), who gave us our Gold Eco Church Award last year, follow along for a new tip every month:

Contribute to wildlife conservation. Clean bird feeders to prevent diseases spreading to winter migrants. Install a nest box well before breeding season to provide a cosy retreat for small birds during cold winter nights. As you observe the local birds reflect on this verse, 'I know every bird in the mountains, and the insects in the fields are mine.' Psalm 50:11
