

WHERE ARE WE WITH LIVING IN LOVE AND

FAITH? Find out at the first meeting of the Sheffield Diocese network of 'Together for the Church of England' on Monday 4 **November** at 7:30 – 9:00 pm. This free event at St Mark's Church, Broomhill will include a summary of where we are with Living in Love and Faith. We'll discuss the next steps for equality and inclusion with General Synod members Nic Tall (National Co-ordinator of Together for the CofE), Malcolm Chamberlain (Archdeacon of Sheffield & Rotherham and a Trustee of Together for the CofE) and Cathy Rhodes (Together contact for Sheffield Diocese). ST MARK'S NEWS:

NEW YOUNG MUSICIANS - We interviewed 4 young people on 17 October who will be joining St Mark's musicians. They range from 10-13 years old. Noah, Agnes and Hugo have been singing with Steel City Choristers. Hugo and Zimmo are going to be playing the organ. We look forward to working alongside them as we share and develop one anothers gifts and skills.

ADMINISTRATION OF HOLY COMMUNION – The PCC met on Monday 21 October and reviewed the verbal and written feedback and the observations we have made we during our 3-month trial of offering both the common cup and intinction. Most people were delighted we are now offering the chalice and have returned to receiving a wafer and drinking directly from the

shared common cup. A few have expressed the preference that we continue to offer the option of intinction because of concerns about transmission of contagious diseases or that we are not being inclusive if we don't cater for peoples' different needs or preferences. After a thorough discussion, the PCC have decided that once we have sourced an appropriate gluten free bread, if possible one that also meets the needs of communicants with other allergies, we will stop offering intinction and move to the single option of bread and common cup. Receiving bread or wine only is considered full Communion and there is no pressure for anyone to drink from the Common Cup. Those who do not want to drink from the Common Cup will be offered the chalice and given the chance to hold it for a moment and then return it to the chalice bearer without consuming any wine. We have heard from other churches that this has been well received and offers a meaningful connection to the cup for those who would rather not drink from it. Shan and Beth

The Bishop of Sheffield is delighted to announce that, following a thorough appointment process, the Revd Dr Beth Keith has been appointed Vicar of the Benefice of St Mark Broomhill and Priest-in-Charge of the Benefice of St Mary Walkley and Oversight Minister of the Three Spires Mission Area. Beth and the family are, of course, very well known to us all. We're not yet sure when the licensing service will be, but at that point, Beth will begin her responsibilities across both churches.

We would like to convey our thanks to all who were involved in the appointment process and look forward to starting a new chapter in the life of St Mark's. Please hold Beth and her family in your prayers as she prepares to move house and take up this new post with us and St Mary's.

WHAT IS IT WORTH - Money, us and St Mark's.

This is the time of year when we have to look at our money. We have to ask how much do we need to enable St Mark's to function effectively and to do what we are being called to do in God's world. We thought it was important to give ourselves the time to think this through together. So, we will be focusing on different aspects of this between October 13th and November 24th. Please read through the <u>information on the website</u> or at the back of church, if you are on our emailing list you should have received an email about this. We have provided detailed information about our finances, and we are asking people to fill in an anonymous <u>questionnaire</u>, so we can gauge what people value about St Mark's and our priorities as we plan for the future.



MIDDLE EAST HUMANITARIAN APPEAL – I'm sure all of you have all seen or heard the news at some time in the last week and are aware of the devastation that the conflict in the Middle East has caused to civilians. In Gaza, ninety percent of the population are displaced and in Lebanon, more than a million people have had to

leave their homes in search of safety. The DEC has launched an emergency appeal to provide the basics of food, emergency shelter and medical assistance. The government have said they will match pound-for- pound up to £10 million donated by the public to this appeal. Please do donate here if you are able to.

COUNTDOWN TO COP 29 - The 29th Conference of the Parties to the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (COP29), to take place in Baku, Azerbaijan, from 11 to 22 November 2024, is a pivotal opportunity to accelerate action to tackle the climate crisis. With global temperatures hitting record highs, and extreme weather events affecting people around the globe, COP29 will bring together leaders from governments, business and civil society to advance concrete solutions to the defining issue of our time. A key focus of COP29 will be on finance, as trillions of dollars are required for countries to drastically reduce greenhouse gas emissions and protect lives and livelihoods from the worsening impacts of climate change. The conference will also be a key moment for countries to present their updated national climate action plans under the Paris agreement, which are due by early 2025. If done right, these plans will limit global warming to 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels and double as investment plans advancing the Sustainable Development Goals Click to find out more about COP 29.



GOOD NEWS ON THE CLIMATE AND

NATURE BILL - Now is an exciting moment for the Climate and Nature Bill, the only plan for a new UK law that addresses the full extent of the climate and nature crisis in line with the most up-to-date science. Thanks to Dr Roz Savage MP, the Bill is now going through Parliament but it needs our help. We need at least 102 MPs to attend the second reading and support the bill on Friday 24 January to take it to the Committee stage.

This year, we will be supporting the Eco Tip calendar provided by Rocha, who gave us our Gold Eco Church Award last year, follow along for a new tip every month:

Green your home. Combat climate change and reduce heating costs by identifying and sealing drafts around your home. Find the gaps that let the cold air in and warm air out (think keyholes, letterboxes, cracks around the edges or bottoms of windows and doors, loft hatches, floorboards, etc.) and fix these gaps using the correct materials and online tutorials. Additionally, place foil or radiator panels to reflect heat into your room. Pray for those who might be experiencing the cold this winter
