### **NEWS AT ST MARK'S:**

ADMINISTRATION OF HOLY COMMUNION – From I December, we will no longer be offering intinction at the I0am service and will move to the single option of homemade bread and the common cup. We are doing our best to make the bread in such a way that everyone can share in Communion, however, we cannot guarantee that the kitchen in which our Communion

Ingredients in our Communion Bread are Doves Freee © Gluten Free bread flour - rice, tapioca, potato starch, Chickpea flour, Sugar, Salt, Sunflower oil, Cider vinegar, Yeast and Water.

Bread is being made is free from gluten or other allergens.

Receiving bread or wine only is considered full Communion and there is no pressure for anyone to drink from the Common Cup. Every adult will be offered the chalice and given the chance to hold it for a moment and then return it to the chalice bearer without consuming any wine. We have heard from other churches that this has been well received and offers a meaningful connection to the cup for those who would rather not drink from it. At the 8am BCP service, we will continue to use wafers and will offer intinction and the Common Cup.

STEWARDSHIP PLEDGE FORM UPDATE - Thank you to everyone who has reviewed their giving and returned their pledge form. We have now heard from about 50% of the congregation and are encouraged by how many people have been able to increase their giving despite current financial pressures. Small amounts given regularly (e.g. by standing order/direct debit) makes a big difference to our church community. In January, the PCC are meeting to discuss what St Mark's priorities are and how we resource those priorities. This will include reviewing the future of the role of Associate Vicar. It would therefore be helpful anyone who has not yet returned a pledge form could let us know whether you plan to become a regular giver or, if you are already a regular giver, if you plan to increase, decrease or keep your giving the same.

The Church of England guidance on giving is to consider giving away 10% of income after tax, with 5% going to the Church and 5% to other charities.



RESPONSE TO 'ASSISTED DYING' BILL - Following the announcement that MP's voted in favour of the bill that would support terminally ill adults with a life expectancy of six months or less to end their lives, several people have been asking questions and raising concerns about the implications of

such legislation and wondering what our role and place as a church is in this.



As a large, diverse church we recognise that there will be many views amongst the members of the congregation. We pray for all those who will be debating the legislation that needs to be put in place before anything can be implemented and that the voices of those who have concerns will be heard alongside the voices of those who support the change.

As part of our Thinking Faith discussions on the second Sunday of the month, one of the Sundays early next year will focus on approaches to life and death offering the opportunity to explore 'Assisted dying' as part of the conversation.

In his Presidential address at Diocesan Synod on 30 November, Bishop Pete spoke of his disappointment at the bill passing due to having serious reservations about its content, while adding he respects everyone's rights to having their own conscientious views on the matter. WRITING TO MPS ABOUT THE CAN BILL - The Climate and Nature bill is really important. Click here to discover more. It is due to receive its vital second reading on Friday, 24 January when it has to be supported by at least 102 MPs. Here is the problem. Many MPs go back to their constituencies on Fridays. Getting 102 MPs to support it may be a problem. So please write to your own MP asking them to support the bill on Friday, 24 January. But we want you to do more than that. Urge our Prime Minister to oversee a full action plan to get our country to Net Zero by 2050 - We don't currently have this plan, despite our targets.
