St Mark's vision is to practise a living, thinking, loving, faith.

Living Faith which is inclusive, vibrant & engaged.

Thinking faith which engages with scripture, tradition, reason & experience.

Loving faith which serves our communities by following Jesus.

So how does this affect the way in which we deliver provision for/with Children and Young People?

When planning provision for any age range, we keep in mind the key words of the vision for St Mark's: Living, Thinking, Loving Faith.

Therefore, we aim to:

- let the children and young people experience and know that 'You are loved!'
- use storytelling, wondering and open questions as an invitation to explore faith, spirituality and church rituals and practices together. In this way we create a space of open exploration where knowledge and wisdom are shared and developed collectively and individually as we wonder!
- provide a variety of opportunities for children and young people to connect with the community: knowing that no one approach will suit all children and young people.
- offer provision that is age-specific, as well as opportunities to engage with wider provision, designed for children to access the ideas in their own way and development stage. This is to broaden the opportunity for community development across the ages without limiting children because of their age or abilities etc.
- support children and young people to choose how to access provision as they reach natural transition points;
 demonstrating that they are ready for a different kind of provision. (This is particularly as they reach school age, or are getting towards primary/secondary transition.)

What does this look like throughout our provision?
