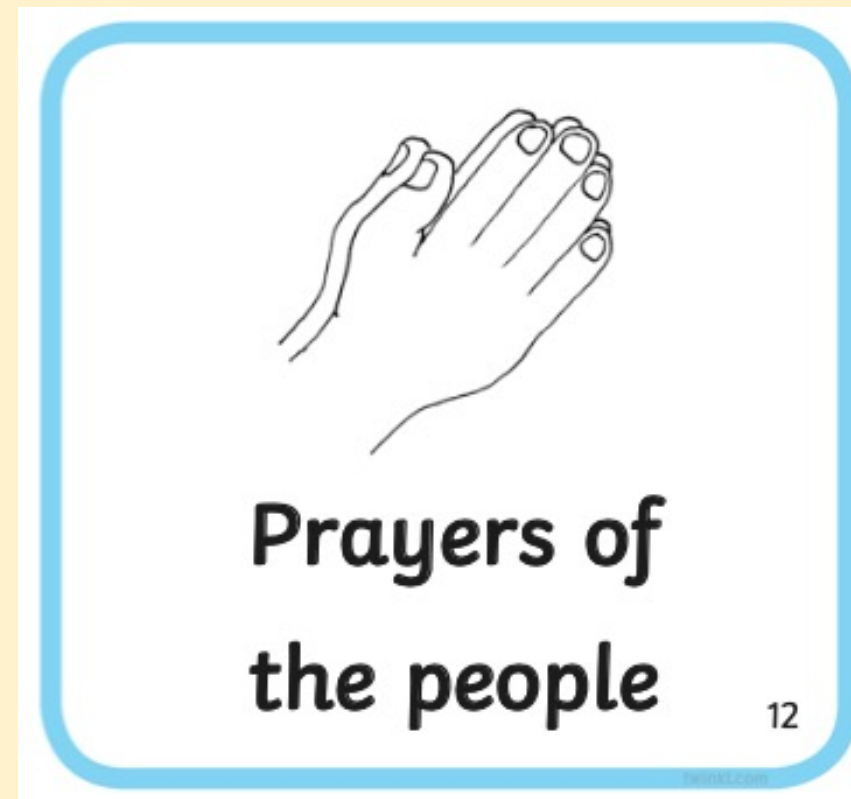

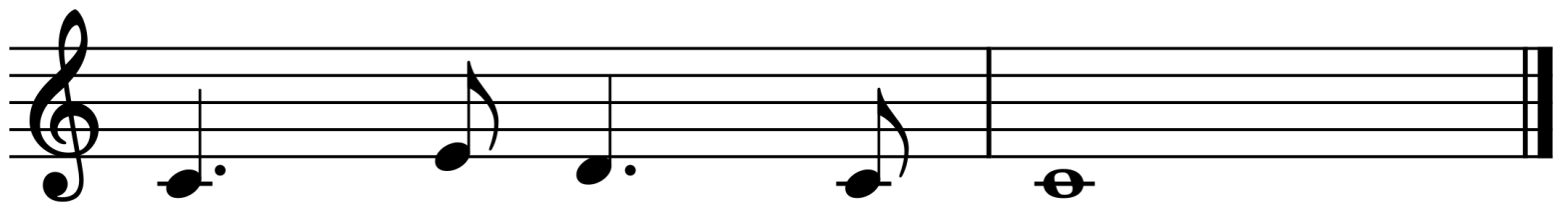

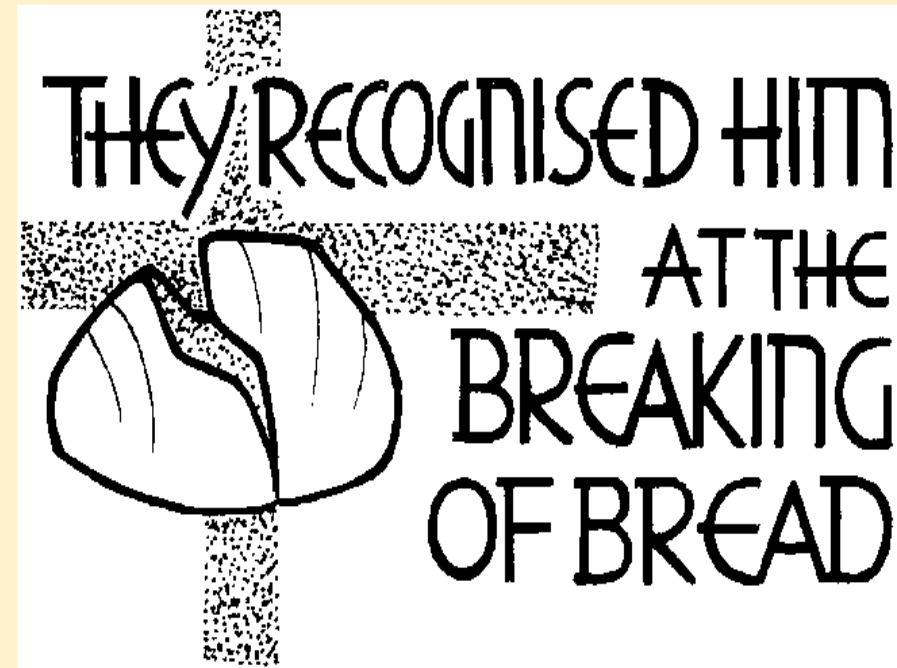
OUR FATHER in heaven,

for the Life of the world.**





In baptism God calls you on a life-long journey.

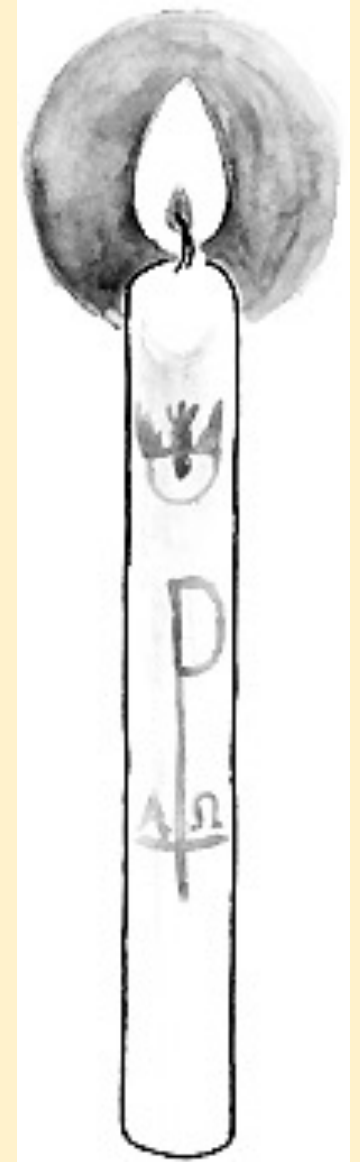
Together with all God's people you are called to explore the way of Jesus, grow in friendship with God and bring forth the fruits of the Spirit.
