A RESPONSE FROM BISHOP PETE - Recently, members of St. Mark's wrote an open letter to the Bishop of Sheffield regarding faith perspectives on the Middle East crisis. We have now received a response stating: "Please assure the members of St Mark's that with my fellow Bishops, I will indeed use my influence to speak up about this crisis as best I can." The full letter is on the notice board at the back of the church.

ADMINISTRATION OF HOLY COMMUNION - It has now been four years since the Covid-19 pandemic and lockdown caused such disruption in our worshipping life. 2 years ago, updated Church of England guidance informed us that "Holy Communion should now be offered in both kinds" unless there were clear and objective reasons not to do so. A year ago, our Bishop wrote to everyone in the Diocese suggesting that would be an appropriate time for PCCs of churches who had not yet returned to sharing the Common Cup to discuss when to resume this practice that is integral to our understanding and experience of Holy Communion. After consultation with the congregation, we decided to continue receiving bread and wine by intinction. Recently, an increasing number of people have started asking when we would be reviewing this decision again. We discussed it at PCC on 17 June and the PCC are minded to return to offering the Common Cup, a step that is being suggested because it is known to be low risk. Rather than do another paperwork exercise to ratify this, we have planned a period of transition over the summer months. From 21 July, we are going to offer both the Common cup and intinction. We appreciate that we are unlikely to get 100% agreement on the way forward and it is our intention that we will move to one option only once we see whether intinction or the Common Cup is most popular. During the transition, we will continue to use wafers, however, if we move to

receiving the Common Cup, we will also return to having a single gluten free loaf that can be shared with everyone. The most important thing to remember is that you do what you feel comfortable with and remember that in the Anglican church, communicating in either kind, just bread or just wine, is considered full communion so you need not share the cup if you feel uneasy about doing so.
