
# Lighting the Advent Candles

A candle for each Sunday of Advent is lit as we sing the following chant.


As the candles are lit in church, you may wish to light a candle at home.

We sit or kneel



### She gave her body for God's shrine, her heart to piercing pain, and knew the cost of love divine when Jesus Christ was slain.



Let us give thanks to our gracious God. It is right to give thanks and praise.




God of our longing, God of our hoping, it is good and right to praise you.


Later, he took a cup of wine, gave thanks, and offered it to them, saying, This cup is the new covenant in my blood, Do this to remember me.
