Books giving a historical perspective:

A New Strength, a New Song. Margaret Webster Mowbray 1994

This book as an account of the campaign for women to be ordained to the priesthood from one of the key organizers of MOW. It shows how hard it was to overcome the trepidation of church leaders and the power of the church decision makers.

Act of Synod, Act of Folly, ed Monica Furlong (SCM Press, 1998)

A collection of essays analysing and describing the effect and the theology of the 1993 Act of Synod which created "Flying Bishops". The Act of Synod no longer exists but it is worth considering how much of the critique still applies to the working out of the 5 Guiding Principles.

Like the Wideness of the Sea. Maggi Dawn (DLT, 2013)

Written after the 2012 failure of legislation to enable women to be bishops in the Cof E . An excellent analysis of why women, both ordained and lay, found this so painful and the church to be so discriminatory.
