Opening Responses

Prayer of Approach and Thanksgiving

Living God, you cherish your creation and we praise you.

With earth, air, water, fire: in our element as your children, we praise you.

With our lips, with our lives, in all our diversity, each one made in your image, we praise you.

Because you share our human lives, our sorrow and joy, we praise you.

We hold a time of quiet together as we reflect on the day that has been. If you wish, feel free to give thanks or pray aloud.

The grace of God meets us now to renew us, reorientate us, restore us.

May the peace of God be always with you. **And also with you**.

Introduction to Sharing

We have shared in thanksgiving and peace; now, in solidarity and agape we remember the story of Jesus' final supper with his friends and share our meal together.

Sharing the Story

I have handed down to you what came to me by direct revelation from the Lord himself. The same night in which he was handed over, he took bread and gave thanks. Then he distributed it to the disciples and said, "Take it and eat your fill. It is my body, which is given for you. Do this to remember me." He did the same with the cup of wine after supper and said, "This cup seals the new covenant with my blood. Drink it—and whenever you drink this, do it to remember me."

Whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you are retelling the story, proclaiming our Lord's death until he comes.

We share a time of silence, lasting approximately 10 minutes, for our own reflections and prayers.

We draw all our prayers together in the words that Jesus taught us:

OUR FATHER in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.
Lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and for ever. Amen.
